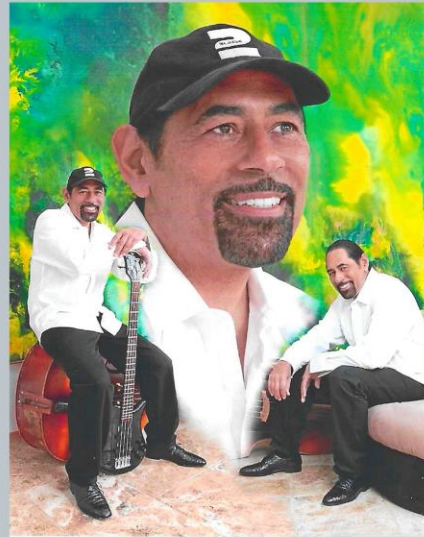

¹ Charles Sullivan, aka “The Mayor of Fillmore,” not only booked the Fillmore Auditorium but held the lease on it and several other Fillmore nightclubs including Bop City. He was also one of the largest promoters of African American music west of the Mississippi creating a tour circuit from Seattle to San Francisco for big name acts like Ike and Tina Turner, James Brown, and Marvin Gaye.
